## Report of the South Carolina Annual Conference



June 10-13, I had my first ever opportunity to serve as a delegate to Annual Conference. Wow! Who knew so much went on at conference? Held in Florence, at the convention center, as has been the case for the last several years, days began early, with morning worship, followed by business sessions taking up what needed to be voted on by all the delegates. Then evening worship closed out the day.

My first impressions of the whole experience, was an enjoyment of wonderful worship services, with beautifully performed music, both traditional and contemporary. The high point of the weekend was Saturday evening's Service of Ordination and Commissioning, when Saint Mark's own, **Paige Matthews Wolfe**, was commissioned a provisional deacon. It was such a proud moment to witness this, having known Paige and her parents Jim and Susan, since Paige's birth. Friday afternoon all the delegates went out into the Florence community to perform a day of service such as working on local home repair, packing food donated for food banks, putting together care packages for our troops, or donating blood. All in all conference for me was a great learning experience, it was also impressive to see the large number of delegates from all around our state, busy with the work of South Carolina's United Methodist Church.

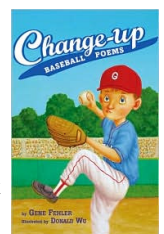
## Library Corner

\* NOTE: Presently our 2008 mortgage is being paid out of our CAPITAL CAMPAIGN FUND (not included in Budget Income noted above) at the rate of \$12,675 per month (\$63,375 through May). The balance remaining in this CAPITAL FUND account is \$84,163, which will be depleted by the end of the year. At that time, we will need to honor our commitment to cover the debt by either refinancing our 1995 and 2008 mortgages or by securing additional gifts/commitments from our congregation to cover the mortgage payments, or a combination of the two. I appreciate the positive response to the Hymn-Sings we have had in conjunction to the Summer Sermon Series. We'll focus singing hymn texts about Covenant Community – July 4; Restoration and Redemption – July 11; and Holy Living – July 25. Hymnology was one of my favorite classes (3) particularly in grad school. The Protestant hymn tradition is rich and we are indebted to wonderful contributors from Charles Wesley (6000 hymns) to Fanny Crosby (9000 hymns)...and Isaac Watts (697 hymns) who is regarded as the Father of English Hymnody. Watts hymn-line is relatively smooth and it was made even smoother by 18th century poets such as Charles Wesley. Some contemporaries of Watts complained that his hymns were "too worldly" for the church. One critic fumed, "Christian congregations have shut out divinely inspired psalms and have taken in Watts's flights of fancy!" His hymns outraged many people, split congregations, and got pastors fired. By age 50 Watts was a national figure, esteemed by Anglicans and Dissenters alike. John Wesley had long acknowledged the genius, discipline and piety of Watts, and when Wesley came to publish his first hymn book, one-third of its hymns were penned by Isaac Watts.
